



# Did you know?

Last year over 236,000 people were touched by United Way of the Greater Dayton Area services. 22,000 more people living in Montgomery, Greene and Preble counties used United Way services than the year before. Here are some of the ways your gift helped changed the lives of our neighbors in need.

- 191** Individuals and families in financial crisis received the education needed to recover from financial difficulties.
- 290** Runaway and homeless youth received emergency shelter and counseling to reunite them with their families.
- 417** Pregnant and parenting teens have received education to ensure their babies have healthy development.
- 1,345** Young children received care and education needed for school readiness.
- 1,811** Homeless clients and their families received shelter and financial literacy training.
- 2,347** People with health conditions requiring medication were connected to long-term prescription solutions.
- 2,405** Youth showed an increase in knowledge of behaviors that reduce the risk of HIV/AIDS infection.
- 2,713** Individuals and families received counseling to help cope with a crisis.
- 3,000** Community residents volunteered their time to help local non-profit organizations.
- 6,307** People living with disabilities and long-term health concerns have an improved quality of life.
- 11,578** Victims of domestic violence received shelter and/or support services to live safely.
- 16,876** At-risk individuals and families received nutritious food during times of need.
